CIRCULAR FOR THE MEMBERS OF SBIPA CHANDIGARH CIRCLE

STRUCTURED MEETING HELD ON 20/06/2024 - FAVOURABLE RESPONSE FROM MANAGEMENT

As the members are aware, we have been holding structured meetings with the management regularly. The meeting for the half year ending June 21024 was held on 20/06/2024 in the conference hall of local Heard office Chandigarh. The management was represented by the DGM & CDO, AGM HR, CM IR and CM PPG and the Association was represented by its President, General Secretary and other circle office bearers as well as modules representatives. The main highlights of the response to our agenda is as under:-

- 1) We are pleased to inform that agreeing to our long pending demand, the circle authorities have identified and approved site for our office in LHO building. The work will start on this site and shortly we will start functioning from our new office.
- 2) Keeping in view the the need of pensioners, we requested the bank to open dispensaries at all RBO centers and centers with strength of 100 pensioners plus serving staff. The bank has agreed to open dispensaries at all RBO centers now and thereafter cover all the centers as requested by us. Besides, on our reference, the bank has agreed to expedite the approval for establishing dispensary at Patiala , Kurukshetra and Hoshiarpur, posting of doctor at Dharamsala and tie up arrangement with hospital in Palampur. Posting of doctor at Bhatinda to be ensured at the earliest.
- 3) There are over 7000 inactive cases of staff pensioners i.e. they are not being paid pension due to some reasons. We requested the management to review all these cases by contacting them. The association offered its support in identifying, locating and approaching them with the sole purpose of reactivating all such accounts. The bank assured to initiate steps to do the needful and appreciated the offer made by association.
- 4) Mutual welfare Scheme subscribers are complaining of non availability of funds for payment of family pension/medical expenses under the scheme. The bank has agreed to ensure adequate funds in future.
- 5) We have been receiving complaints from our members that they are not being paid the stagnation increment due to non availability of record and they are being compelled to approach various offices for the purpose. We, therefore, requested the management to post a nodal officer to look after all the needs of pensioners. The bank has agreed to our request and also assured to look into pending cases of stagnation increments. The nodal officer will also attend to all complaints by pensioners including relating to deposit/loan accounts, behavior of branch functionaries, cyber crimes etc.
- 6) A few of the members complained about nonpayment of arrears on account of revision in pension after allowing 50% of basic without any ceiling irrespective of cadre. We requested the management to look into all these cases on priority basis and pay the legitimate arrears to them. The bank agreed to our request and assured to do the needful on priority basis.
- 7) Reduction in Basic pay upon removal of 40%, 50% anomaly -In many cases, the pensioners complained of reduction in their basic pension upon refixation after removal of 40.50% anomaly. As per CCS rules the pension can never be reduced unless some punishment is inflicted on pensioner. The bank has agreed to take up the matter with Corporate Centre suitably.
- 8) The grievances redressal program me at AOs & RBOs to be chaired by senior functionaries, acknowledgement be issued and the issues to be resolved in a time bound manner.

- 9) The structured meetings will be held at all AOs/RBOs regularly.
 - 10) The bank to provide all circulars relating to pensioners to SBIPA.
 - 11) The bank has also agreed to hold regular meetings with TPAs/ Broker etc at AO/RBO level as is being done at LHO.
 - 12) The bills of pensioners pertaining to the period prior to retirement to be reconsidered for payment
 - 13) Bank to respond to all the correspondences emanating from SBIPA.
 - 14) The bank will recommend to Corporate Centre for favourable consideration of following:-
 - I) Making Holiday Homes booking pensioners' friendly.
 - II) eSBOP issues with regard to medical facilities
 - III) Expediting inclusion of handicapped children of pensioners for family pension.
 - IV) Charging of excess interest on loans against FDRs in case of pre mature payment.
 - V) Allowing staff interest on deposits of SBIPA held with the bank'
 - VI) Reduction in recovery period of commutation of pension.
- Friends, we are thankful to the DY Gen Manager and CDO for positive response on all the issues included in our agenda.

PAYMENT OF COMMUTED VALUE OF PENSION REDUCTION IN RECOVERY PERIOD

Please refer to my telephonic conversation on the captioned subject. I am sure the matter stands taken up with the concerned authorities suitably. In this connection, I may submit that the bank pensioners are already being subjected to a great loss due to inferior commutation factor which is 6.6% while the same for government pensioners is 9.81%. It means that our pensioners are getting lesser commuted value of pension while the recovery period is the same i.e. 15 years. In the wake of decline in rate of interest, the 5th Pay commission recommended to reduce the period from 15 years to 12 years. The commission also took note of increased average life span of government employees which as per WHO was 77 years at that time. Gujarat Government implemented such recommendations vide their resolution No. NVT 102010/D/166/P dated 12/10/2022 and reduced the recovery period to 12 years. Recently, while hearing the WCP 2490 /2024 &

8222/2024 titled R S Jindal vs government of Punjab and others, stayed the recovery of commuted pension from those who have paid for more than 128 months as the petitioner convincingly pleaded that as per the present rate of interest, the amount gets recovered in 10 years and 8 months (128 months). The final decision will, however, be taken after the reply to notice served on defendants is received and the matter is argued before the bench. The publication of the news about the above stay orders awakened the SBI pensioners and they immediately started contemplating filing of CWP in Punjab & Haryana High Court to get justice in the matter. The Federation of SBIPA is competent enough to take up the matter with concerned authorities and get the issue resolved. In case the authorities do not respond positively, the other avenues available with the federation can be explored in the interest of affected pensioners viz. seeking help of working federations and resorting to legal action. The commutation factor can also be improved along with reduction in period of recovery. You are very kindly requested to treat the matter as most urgent and keep all the affiliates updated of the developments in the matter. Thanks and regards

Donation

Our members are aware that the court case to ensure 50% of last drawn pay as pension for all the employees of State Bank of India from the date of their retirement was first lodged in the Supreme Court of India in 2011, which was subsequently transferred to the High court in Delhi in 2013. Finally our demand is fulfilled albeit partially as the DFS, Govt. of India has directed our Bank to pay the enhanced pension 'prospectively' w.e.f. 10.11.2023. This surely does not match our demand. Hence, on the date of next hearing, i.e. on 02.05.24, we will have to apprise the court of our dissatisfaction and pray for a judgment on our plaint.

If the court pronounces judgment according to our prayer, there is every possibility that Government will prefer for a petition before the Supreme Court and if the court in its verdict uphold the decision of DFS, our Federation will have to submit a petition in the Apex court. Either way, it will require for us to incur a huge amount of money, either as a plaintiff or as a defendant. We have already incurred an expenditure to the tune of almost Rs.2 crore (approx) during the last thirteen years and the impending legal fight will also require a huge amount to fulfill the rightful demand of our members.

In view of the foregoing, our Federation has decided to appeal to all the beneficiaries to donate at least Rs.2000/- to replenish and strengthen our legal fund. We hope many of our members will not hesitate to donate more voluntarily for a right cause.

Text of Circular No.: CDO/P&HRD-PPFG/14/2024-25 Dated : Fri 14 Jun 2024

NOMINATION FACILITY TO STAFF PENSIONERS FOR SETTLEMENT OF UNDISBURSED PENSIONARY DUES AND AMENDMENT IN SBI EMPLOYEES' PENSION REGULATIONS, 2014

Nomination facility for Staff Pensioners for settlement of undisbursed pensionary dues was approved by the Central Board of the Bank in its meeting dated 04.02.2021 and 04.08.2021, necessitating amendments in SBI Employees' Pension Fund Regulations, 2014.

2. State Bank of India Employees' Pension Fund (Amendment) Regulations, 2024 has been published in the Gazette of India on 20.03.2024 and a new regulation 23A - Nomination, has been inserted in the State Bank of India Employees' Pension Fund Regulations, 2014. Details of the nomination facility and process to be followed by the staff/ pensioners/ branches is attached as Annexure - 'A'.

3. Nomination is not mandatory but optional at the discretion of the employees/ pensioners. To register for the nomination, an application in Form 'A' has to be submitted in triplicate, one copy each to be retained at pension paying branch, Circle PPG and PPG-AMC, Kolkata. Specimen copy of application - Form 'A' for making nomination under sub-regulation (1) or (2) of Regulation 23(A) is attached as Annexure-'B'.

4. Please bring the contents of the circular to the knowledge of all concerned.
